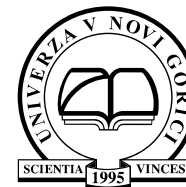

BACHELOR'S STUDY PROGRAMME LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE IN THE DIGITAL WORLD

The programme is intended for anyone interested in literature, linguistics and culture. Emphasis is placed on the development of digital and interdisciplinary competencies. With a practical training, the study programme aims to deepen the students acquired skills and knowledge. The study programme offers three directions (course tracks):

- **Slovene Studies:** wide fundamental knowledge in Slovene studies, general linguistics and literary sciences;
- **Literature and Culture:** fundamental knowledge in the fields of literary sciences, cultural studies, digital humanities, literary and cultural history, media and popular cultures;
- **Slovene Language and Language Data:** fundamental linguistics knowledge, Slovene language and language in general, technical knowledge and digital skills.

BACHELOR'S STUDY PROGRAMME CULTURAL HISTORY

The programme offers an in-depth study with an opportunity for critical thinking and discussion on historical periods, with a special emphasis on cultural perspectives. Students learn about topics such as prehistory, life of noble families, peasant people and bourgeoisie, multiculturalism and migration, cultural heritage, history of emigration communities, gender history, social movements and revolutions, World War II, cultural tourism, archivistics, creative and cultural industries. In addition to theoretical knowledge, the students widen their horizons through solving concrete research issues that contribute to understanding the local and international space. At the intersection of the Slavic, Roman and Germanic world, this study programme may be viewed as a significant support for the Slovenian community abroad.

Both of the two Bachelor's study programmes at the School of Humanities offer practical placement, thus deepening the students acquired skills and knowledge; at the same time, students are prepared for working in both traditional and contemporary research, as well as professional and pedagogical environments.

MASTER'S STUDY PROGRAMME HUMANITIES STUDIES

This programme is a continuation of the undergraduate programmes Language and Literature in the Digital World and Cultural History. The study programme is also open to graduates of other programmes covering the fields of history, cultural studies, literary or linguistic sciences. The study programme offers three directions (course tracks):

- **Histories and Cultures of Cross-border Spaces:** a comprehensive and interdisciplinary approach to scientific analysis and interpretation of historical and cultural processes in border and cross-border regions;
- **Literary Sciences:** a comprehensive insight into literary sciences and scientific research, methods and tools;
- **Linguistics:** a comprehensive insight into the scientific treatment of linguistic phenomena.

The study programme emphasises independent research work and provides a wide range of elective content. Through research projects and academic exchanges, the programme is linked to diverse study fields, thus providing the opportunity for a wide humanistic education; at the same time, it offers an opportunity for a more focused, narrow orientation in certain disciplines. The study programme is defined by its content integrity and interdisciplinary insight into different fields of study.
