



CALL FOR THE LONG-TERM PHYSICAL MOBILITY OF STUDENTS WITHIN THE ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME FOR THE 2026/2027 ACADEMIC YEAR

University of Nova Gorica is launching a call for the mobility of students for the purpose of **STUDYING** abroad in the 2026/2027 academic year

I. THE PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE CALL

Erasmus+ is the EU programme that supports activities in the fields of education, training, youth and sports. The purpose of the Erasmus program is to raise the quality of education and training, thereby strengthening social cohesion and the competitiveness of the EU economy. Erasmus+ aims to enable the participation of as many individuals as possible, especially those from environments with fewer opportunities, and highlights and as key the contents and activities of inclusion, participation in democratic life, shared values and civic engagement, environmental preservation and the fight against climate change (green Erasmus+) and transition to a digital society.

The Erasmus+ programme enables students to complete part of the study obligations of the enrolled programme at any level of study at a partner institution abroad rather than at the University of Nova Gorica (home institution). Partner institutions are institutions with which the University of Nova Gorica has signed an interinstitutional agreement on student exchange. Programme countries are specified as all the Member States of the European Union (EU), and the associated countries; Northern Macedonia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey and Serbia, while **partner countries** are specified as all other world countries.

The period of long-term physical mobility abroad can run for no less than 2 and no more than 12 months at each level of study; moreover, the mobility is to be carried out in the period from 1 October 2026 to 30 September 2027. The student may combine the period of physical mobility with the period of virtual mobility, which may last up to a total of 12 months. Virtual activity is not financed by Erasmus+.

The mobility objectives:

- Improvement of learning competences,
- Increasing employability and employment opportunities,
- Increasing self-initiative and entrepreneurship,
- Increasing self-confidence and self-esteem,
- Improving knowledge of foreign languages and digital competences,
- Increasing intercultural awareness,
- More active participation in society,
- Strengthening positive interaction with people from different background,
- Better knowledge of EU projects and EU values,
- Increasing motivation for further education (formal and informal),
- Training after completing mobility.



The student is to obtain a minimum of 20 ECTS per semester at a partner institution. Successfully completed obligations at the partner institution are recognised at the home institution based on a study agreement concluded before the departure.

The student may not undergo mobility in the country of his/her residence or in the country of the sending institution.

In principle, the student status during mobility abroad is treated as equivalent to the status of students at a partner institution. All sources of scholarship from the home country remain unchanged; moreover, the student is not obliged to pay tuition at the partner institution. The partner institution may not charge tuition, enrolment, exam, etc. fees to the visiting Erasmus+ student. Small amounts, e.g., costs of insurance, photocopies, etc., may be charged to the student.

According to the national rules of the home institution, each student is entitled to receive financial support within the Erasmus+ programme. Financial support is exclusively aimed at co-financing the costs of eligible activities and in no case covers all mobility costs.

Students selected for the Erasmus+ mobility program are recommended to undergo online language assessment (OLS) for the language they will be using during their mobility, via the EU Academy platform before their departure.

II. ERASMUS+ FINANCIAL SUPPORT AND ADDITIONAL FUNDS

Amount of financial support for individual groups of countries for the 2026/2027 academic year:

a) ERASMUS+ financial support for students intended for the STUDY

*For distances less than 500 km, participants typically use low-emission transportation options.

**Green travel; traveling by train, bus, carpooling (van, bus), bicycle. Green travel must cover more than 50% of the total journey. Upon return, the student must provide completed and signed Declaration of honour and appropriate evidence of the mode of travel. The student is eligible for funding for a maximum of 6 additional travel days.

The [Erasmus distance calculator](#) is used to calculate the distance. The starting location is always the headquarters of the University of Nova Gorica (Rožna Dolina).

a) Other allowances

Furthermore, the student may apply for:

- supplement for students from the environment with fewer opportunities; a student coming from an environment with fewer opportunities receives an additional 250 EUR per month. A student with fewer opportunities is defined as one who:
 - has the CSD decision (is a recipient of a state scholarship, social financial aid, welfare allowance, child allowance or allowance for large families);
 - has the ZRSŠ / ZZZS decision (supporter, adjustment of lessons, disability, etc.);
 - comes from a single-parent (a single parent family is a community in which one of the parents lives with the children while the other of the two parents has died and the child does not receive support from him, or the other of the two parents is unknown, or when the child does not receive alimony from the other parent in the event of a divorce);
 - comes from a foster family;
 - has a status of a parent;
 - is a member of a family where one of the children or parents has a decision of ZRSŠ/CSD/ZZZS
 - is granted international protection;
 - is a representative of a Roma community
- additional funds for mobility intended for participants with special needs.

The student who applies for this call will be subsequently informed of all further procedures, additional funding and linguistic preparation by the Erasmus+ institutional coordinator to the e-mail address provided in the application.



III. BASIC CONDITIONS FOR APPLYING TO THE CALL

A student of the University of Nova Gorica who meets the following conditions may apply to the call:

- is enrolled in at least the second year of the first-stage studies while studying abroad;
- has an active student status at the University of Nova Gorica during the mobility period;
- has not yet taken advantage of 12 months of exchange under the Erasmus+ programme at the level of study to which he/she will be enrolled in the 2026/2027 academic year (the total of already completed studies and completed and requested practical training abroad may not exceed 12 months per individual study level - virtual activity is excluded).
- Passing an exam in at least one mandatory subject in the study program in which the student is enrolled.

IV. CONTENT OF THE APPLICATION TO THE CALL

A student who wishes to apply for the call must attach the following documents to the electronic application form:

- a motivation letter in English, which must also indicate the traineeship programme (minimum one and maximum two pages);
- a curriculum vitae (CV);
- Transcript of Records

V. METHOD OF APPLICATION AND DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATION

The deadline for submitting the application is **8 April 2026**.

Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered.

VI. SELECTION PROCEDURE

The verification of compliance with the basic eligibility requirements for the call and the formal review of applications will be carried out by the Erasmus+ Institutional Coordinator of the University of Nova Gorica.

Applications submitted by students who do not meet the basic eligibility requirements for the call will be rejected.

Complete applications submitted by the deadline will be forwarded by the Erasmus+ Institutional Coordinator of the University of Nova Gorica to the faculty or academy in which the student is enrolled, where the application will be assessed on the basis of the motivation letter (from 0 to 10 points). A student applying for a traineeship mobility at one of the partner universities within the ACROSS alliance (<https://www.across-alliance.eu/> link to the catalogue: https://ung.si/documents/3884/ACROSS_Mobility_guide_UNG_EN.pdf) will receive 2 additional points.



Based on the number of points achieved and the availability of places at individual partner institutions, a ranking list of candidates for each host institution will then be prepared.

Based on the ranking lists of the individual faculties or academy, the Erasmus+ Institutional Coordinator will prepare a university-wide ranking list of candidates for the allocation of financial support for the entire University of Nova Gorica.

If the University of Nova Gorica is not granted sufficient funds by the European Commission or the National Agency (CMEPIUS – Centre of the Republic of Slovenia for Mobility and European Educational and Training Programmes) to support all proposed mobilities, priority in the allocation of financial support will be given to students with fewer opportunities. If the number of such mobilities also exceeds the approved funding, priority will be given to students in higher years of study.

The student will be informed of their placement on the University of Nova Gorica's list of candidates by the Erasmus+ Institutional Coordinator via the email address provided in the electronic application form.
